





SWITCHING FIELDS: Inside the Fight to Remake Men's Soccer in the United States by George Dohrmann

Pulitzer Prize-winning sports journalist, George Dorhmann, unravels why the United States has failed to produce elite men's soccer players for so long—and shows why a golden generation just might be coming. As the U.S. women's national soccer team was on a path toward worldwide dominance, the mediocrity of the men's team was stunning—they failed to even qualify for the 2018 World Cup and the last three Olympics. His first book, PLAY THEIR HEARTS OUT (Ballantine, 2010), was named one of the best books of literary journalism of the twenty-first century by *GQ* and called one of the finest sports books of all time by *Harper's* and *The New York Times*. He won a Pulitzer Prize at the St. Paul Pioneer Press for a series of stories that uncovered academic fraud within a college basketball program. He lives in Ashland, Oregon, with his family.






THE PARIS LINE by Matthew Goodman

A thrilling, propulsive story about truly inspiring characters – two conventional, seemingly unremarkable women, who are called upon by the circumstances of history to discover within themselves a capacity for heroism, resistance and toughness they might never have imagined themselves capable of.

In the early days of the Nazi occupation of France, two middle-aged women, close friends, a transplanted Jewish New Yorker named Etta Shiber and a British expatriate, Kate Bonnefous, find themselves in the role of unlikely resistance heroes when they impulsively decide to rescue a British soldier left behind in the Dunkirk evacuation, transporting him to Paris in the luggage compartment of their car, and from there on to safety. Galvanized into further action, they ally themselves with a young priest from a rural village in the north and become the key link in a network that will rescue over a hundred stranded British soldiers hiding in the woods and barns and forests of France. Finally arrested by the Gestapo, both women separately endure brutally harsh confinement in a series of prisons and labor camps, neither of them ever naming a collaborator even under torture; against all odds, both survive to emerge at the end of the war, physically broken but triumphant in spirit.

Matthew Goodman is the author of four previous books of nonfiction: EIGHTY DAYS (Ballantine, 2013), THE SUN AND THE MOON (Basic Books); THE CITY GAME (Ballantine, 2019), and JEWISH FOOD (William Morrow). She earned a Ph.D. at the University of California at San Diego and later a law degree at the University of Texas at Austin Law School. Her investigative work earned her a place on the *Time* 100 list of most influential people and was recognized by the journal *Nature* as one of "10 People Who Mattered in Science in 2018."


In the early 2000s, Adrian Hong was a soft-spoken Yale undergraduate looking for his place in the world. After reading a harrowing account of life inside North Korea, he realized he had found a cause so pressing that he was ready to devote his life to it.

What began as a trip down the safe and well-worn path of organizing soon morphed into something more dangerous. Hong journeyed to China, outwitting Chinese security services as he helped asylum-seeking North Koreans escape across the border. Meanwhile, Hong's secret organization, Cheollima Civil Defense (later renamed Free Joseon), began tracking the North Korean government's activities, and its volatile third-generation ruler, Kim Jong-un. Free Joseon targeted North Korean diplomats who might be persuaded to defect, while drawing up plans for a government-in-exile. After the shocking broad-daylight assassination in 2017 of Kim Jong-nam, the dictator's older brother, Hong, along with U.S. Marine veteran Christopher Ahn, helped ferry Kim Jong-nam's family to safety. Then Hong took the group a step further. He initiated a series of high-stakes direct actions, culminating in an armed raid at the North Korean embassy in Madrid—an act that would put Ahn behind bars and turn Hong into one of the world's most unlikely fugitives.

WILDFLOWER: My Journey to Becoming an American Optimist by Aurora James

Aurora James's story is not a "success story." Or at least, it shouldn't be told that way. Having dropped out of high school, struggled with body image, and dabbled in street racing, her eventual arrest might have been her rock bottom. But as a visionary and optimist, that experience became one of many that reshaped her way of thinking about the world. After a brief modeling stint, James discovered the real power in creating for the runway and started her own business in a flea market, a sustainable fashion line showcasing traditional African design that would become an award-winning international brand. Then she founded one of the fastest-growing social justice nonprofits, the Fifteen Percent Pledge. But none of this came from a desire to "succeed." It came from a desire to forge a new creative path—and to lift others up alongside her.

Already a rising star in fashion and the first Black American female designer to win a CFDA Award, James was inspired by the activism that swept the nation in the summer of 2020 to think bigger about how to empower Black business owners. With an idea and an Instagram post, she founded the Fifteen Percent Pledge, which challenges retailers to commit 15% of their shelf space and spending power to Black businesses. To date, more than two dozen of the world's most recognized retailers have taken the pledge, redirecting \$10 billion in revenue to Black brands.

Empowering and full of heart, **WILDFLOWER** is the story of how Aurora James got to where she is now and a rallying cry for those eager to make change.





We all know how the Civil War was won: by a courageous troop of Yankees who triumphed over the South. For three decades, Robbie Robertson has produced soundtracks for Martin Scorsese's films, a relationship that began when Robertson convinced Scorsese to direct *The Last Waltz*, the iconic film of the Band's farewell performance at the Winterland Ballroom on Thanksgiving 1976.

The closing of the Band's story with that landmark concert opened a new door in Robbie Robertson's life--specifically the door to Scorsese's Malibu home. With both men on the outs with their wives, Robertson moved into Scorsese's place, inaugurating a two-year "lost weekend" of wild revelry and adventure. Though both men had already accomplished culture-changing feats, neither had reached thirty-five years of age, and each in his way stood at a creative precipice, searching for the beginning of a new phase of life and work. Their shared journey would take them around the world and down the rabbit hole of American culture in the long hangover of the seventies, a path lined with equal parts hedonism and paranoia, set against the backdrop of the disco-fueled streets of New York and the grand mansions of Mulholland Drive. With a cast of characters featuring Robert De Niro, Harvey Keitel, Sam Peckinpah, and many more, **INSOMNIA** is an intimate portrait of a remarkable creative friendship, one that would explore the outer limits of excess and experience before returning to tell the tale.

Robbie Robertson was the guitarist and principal songwriter in the Band. He has produced many movie soundtracks for Martin Scorsese and others, and continues to record as a solo artist. His previous book, TESTIMONY (Crown, 2017), was a *New York Times* bestseller.

At forty-five, Tracee Ellis Ross faced the question of whether she should freeze her eggs or not—but the question of to freeze or not to freeze was a proxy for a deeper reckoning: she was probably not going to have children, a husband, or a traditional home and family as she had always unconsciously imagined. And at every stage, she accumulated answers, along with cautionary tales.

The questions didn't get easier as an adult. Ross takes us along her career and through a variety of fraught relationships with directors and photographers, romantic partners and her indomitable mother, as she keeps trying to find an identity that fits. Along the way she begins to gather more wisdom: from hard experience, from books that light up her mind, from movements for justice that draw her in, and from a community of women who hold each other up. In the end, she finds peace in her struggle, anchored by the idea that she has always been enough.

Tracee Ellis Ross is an American actress, singer, television host, producer and director. The daughter of Diana Ross, she is known for her lead roles in the television series *Girlfriends* and *Black-ish*. She owns Pattern Beauty, a hair-care line for curly hair.



Meek Mill has lived two lives. One is the life of a platinum-selling recording artist. Meek has recorded with everyone from Mariah Carey to Jay-Z to Drake and his solo albums have opened at the top of the *Billboard* charts. He started from the bottom—his father was murdered in an attempted robbery when Meek was five; his mother hustled to get money to raise him and his sister - but climbing through the ranks of Philly's competitive world of battle rappers, Meek eventually found international fame.

The other life is as a young man who has spent the bulk of his life in America's broken criminal justice system. As a nineteen-year-old, Meek was convicted on controversial gun and drug charges, and from that point on lived in the world of incarceration, probation, and parole. For ten years after he completed his sentence, Meek's freedom was determined by one whimsical, possibly corrupt judge. But in 2019, Meek was released from prison and his initial case was reopened by Philadelphia's reformminded DA, who recognized the irregularities in the original trial. Meek was finally free.

In this book, Meek will tell the story of his two lives. Not just as someone whose talent for words would make him a star, but as a kid who was always in the crosshairs of a system he didn't understand, where class and race converge to create a permanent criminal class in this country. It is both a gritty narrative of life in South Philly and the story of how art liberated one life, a handbook to the rules of the street that through his activism he's pushing to transform.

Robert Rihmeek Williams, known professionally as **Meek Mill,** is an American rapper, singer, songwriter, and activist. Born and raised in Philadelphia, he embarked on his music career as a battle rapper, and later formed a short-lived rap group, The Bloodhoundz.



THEY CALLED ME A LIONESS: A Palestinian Girl's Fight for Freedom by Ahed Tamimi and Dena Takruri

A Palestinian activist jailed at sixteen after a confrontation with Israeli soldiers shines a light on the daily struggles of life under occupation in this moving, deeply personal memoir.

"What would you do if you grew up repeatedly seeing your home raided? Your parents arrested? Your mother shot? Your uncle killed? Try, if just for a moment, to imagine this was your life. How would you want the world to react?"

Ahed Tamimi's father was born in 1967, the year that the Israeli occupation of the West Bank began, and every aspect of their family's life has been touched by it. One of Ahed's earliest memories is visiting her father in prison, poking her three-year-old fingers through the fence to touch his hand. The ubiquitous security checkpoints and armed guards even found their way into her childhood fairytales and playdates. Her grandmother regaled her not with nursery rhymes, but with the sage of her family and its tragedies. Instead of cops and robbers, there was Jaysh o 'Arab, or "Army and Arabs," where children roleplayed as Israeli soldiers opposing a community of Palestinians.

She recounts all of this and more in her vivid and riveting memoir, one of the first to deal directly with what life in occupation actually means for the people in it, beyond geography or policy. It brings readers into the daily life of the young woman seen as a freedom-fighting hero by some and a naïve agitator by others. Beyond recounting her well-publicized interactions with Israeli soldiers, there is her unwavering commitment to family and her fearless command of her own voice, despite threats, intimidation, and even incarceration. An essential addition to a complicated conversation, **THEY CALLED ME A LIONESS** lets each of us see what is at stake for the people who live in the West Bank. With her honest, unflinching reflections of a lifelong struggle, Ahed Tamimi shines a light on the humanity not just in the pro-Palestine movement, but all political efforts that speak for the unsung.

Ahed Tamimi is a Palestinian student activist from the village of Nabi Salih in the West Bank.

These profiles have the same draw of that inviting voice and shocking edge. He profiles Michael Jackson, The Rock, OJ Simpson, Jay-Z, Hurricane Katrina, Bill Cosby, Elon Musk, Quentin Tarantino, Norman Lear, Eddie Murphy, and Malcolm X. Along the way, he relates hilarious personal stories and even delves into thorny conspiracy theories, earnestly investigating both sides to show what they reveal about the people who believe them (himself included). Carmichael, like his best jokes, hold an unforgiving mirror up to the society.

Jerrod Carmichael was the creator, writer, producer, and star of three seasons of his semi-autobiographical sitcom, *The Carmichael Show* on NBC, which was known for its fearlessness in approaching issues of race and identity in America. After moving to LA from his native North Carolina in 2008, his meteoric rise has also already included three HBO comedy specials, *Love at the Store, 8*, and *Home Videos*, as well as appearances alongside Zac Efron and Seth Rogen in *Neighbors* and *Neighbors 2*. He directed and produced the upcoming film *On the Count of Three*, which he will also star in alongside Christopher Abbott and Tiffany Haddish. In 2022, he won an Emmy for Outstanding Writing for a Variety Special for his special, *Rothaniel*.

As an illustrator, her work has been exhibited at several galleries including the Tate, The Design Museum and the House of Illustration. Long before the groundbreaking film *Crazy Rich Asians* was setting box-office records, director Jon Chu was a movie-obsessed first-generation Chinese American, helping at his parents' restaurant and forever facing the cultural identity crisis endemic to people of color in the United States. "You need an original vision, the conviction that your story is worth telling, and co-conspirators who are every bit as hungry as you are to share something new with the world. Then you get the car keys."

Jon Chu is an American film director, producer, and screenwriter. He is the director of the big screen adaptations *Crazy Rich Asians* and Quiara Alegría Hudes and Lin Manuel Miranda's *In the Heights*. He executive produced the Apple TV Plus series, *Home Before Dark*, and directed several episodes. Chu has now been tapped to direct *Wicked*.

He also introduced the first openly lesbian character for Marvel, Victoria Montesi, and created and authored QUEER NATION: *The Online Gay Comic*. 

He has served as secretary general of the Arts Council for Great Britain. Everitt lives near England's first recorded town, Colchester, which was founded by the Romans.

Henriques begins with the stock market crash of 1929 that brought Wall Street to its knees, and the key figures that shaped the events and decisions afterward that irrevocably shaped the current financial landscape. **TAMING THE STREET** features a larger-than-life cast of historical figures, including then-Governor and later-President Franklin D. While the SEC's importance has diminished, Henriques argues that the story behind its creation is a hopeful one, one that provides an inspiring example about what an enlightened government once did, and could do again, to level the playing field for the American dream.

Diana Henriques is the author of A FIRST-CLASS CATASTROPHE: *The Road to Black Monday, the Worst Day in Wall Street History* (Holt, 2017), THE WIZARD OF LIES: *Bernie Madoff and the Death of Trust* (Times Books, 2011), and three other books on business history. She was a staff writer for the *New York Times* from 1989 to 2012 and has been a contributing writer since then. She was a Pulitzer finalist in 2005 and recipient of the George Polk Award, Harvard's Goldsmith Prize for Investigative Reporting and the Worth Bingham Prize.



She has worked in both the public and private sectors on projects addressing early childhood development, physical and mental health, playful learning, workforce innovation, family engagement, aging, creativity, social justice, and underresourced communities through the lens of the arts.

Ivy Ross is the vice president of hardware design at Google. Drawing on her background in wideranging fields including sound therapy, quantum physics, psychology, and play, Ivy leads a team that has won more than 140 design awards. *Insider* recently named her one of the 15 Most Powerful Women at Google.





LIFE'S WORK: A Memoir by David Milch

The creator of DEADWOOD and NYPD BLUE reflects on his unlikely life, driven by a nearly insatiable creative energy and a twin penchant for self-destruction—**LIFE'S WORK** is a profound, literary memoir from a brilliant mind taking stock as Alzheimer's loosens his hold on his own past.

From the start, Milch's life seems destined to echo that of his father, a successful if drug-addicted surgeon. Almost every achievement is accompanied by an act of self-immolation, but the deepest sadnesses also contain moments of grace.

Betting on racehorses and stealing booze at eight years old, mentored by Robert Penn Warren and excoriated by Richard Yates at twenty-one, Milch never did anything halfway. He got into Yale Law only to be expelled for shooting out streetlights with a shotgun. He paused his studies at the lowa Writers' Workshop to manufacture acid in Cuernavaca. He created and wrote some of the biggest, most lauded television series of all time, made a family and pursued sobriety, and then lost his fortune betting horses, just as his father had taught him.

Like Milch's best screenwriting, **LIFE'S WORK** explores how chance encounters, self-deception, and luck shape the people we become, and wrestles with what it means to have felt and caused pain, even and especially with those we love, and how you keep living. It is both a masterclass on Milch's unique creative process, and a distinctive, revelatory memoir from one of the great American writers, in what may be his final dispatch to us all.

David Milch graduated summa cum laude from Yale University, where he won the Tinker Prize. He earned an MFA from the Iowa Writers' Workshop at the University of Iowa. He worked as a writing teacher and lecturer in English literature at Yale. During his teaching career, he assisted Robert Penn Warren and Cleanth Brooks in the writing of several college textbooks on literature. His poetry and fiction have been published in *The Atlantic* and *Southern Review*. Among many other credits, Milch created and wrote the shows NYPD BLUE, JOHN FROM CINCINNATI, LUCK, and DEADWOOD.

By engaging with these opinions, analysis, and anecdotes a full view of the workplace emerges from managers and supervisors to entry and mid-level employees. Amy Ellis Nutt traces the history of mental health treatment in the United States, adopting a similar approach to what Siddhartha Mukherjee did so well for cancer in THE EMPEROR OF ALL MALADIES. By bringing to life the discoveries, characters, and trends of the past two centuries, with an emphasis on the past 60 years and the advent of psychiatric drugs, Nutt shows that despite our increased knowledge about the brain, we still don't know what causes mental illness.
