

After a thousand years of war, the Holy Vaalbaran Empire has surrendered to the Ominirish Republic. There is finally peace—even if that peace is just an illusion. This means little to Enitan ljebu, a citizen of Koriko, a country ruthlessly annexed by Vaalbara in her childhood. Enitan works as a scribe, but all she wants is to quit her day job, expand her fledgling tea hobby into a business, and support her brilliant sibling, Xiang, who is studying to become an architect. Despite increasingly harsh Vaalbaran military law, Enitan and Xiang have carved out a happy little life within their Korikese community. But then Xiang goes missing, and Enitan realizes their disappearance is tied to something


sinister within Vaalbara that reaches the highest political levels. She approaches her lover, Koriko's territory governor Ajani, for help, but when that ends in tragedy, Enitan must volunteer herself as a political prisoner, heading to the heart of the Vaalbaran capital with only her tea tray as a weapon. To stay alive and find Xiang, she will have to use her tea ceremonies as an opportunity to glean political secrets, but what she learns may upend Vaalbara and her world forever.

Remy Pendergast is many things: the only son of the Duke of Valenbonne (though his father might wish otherwise), an elite bounty hunter of rogue vampires, and an outcast among his fellow Reapers. His mother was a subject of gossip even before she eloped with a vampire, giving rise to rumors that Remy is a half-vampire himself. Remy's whole life, his father has been shaping him into a weapon to fight for the kingdom of Aluria, though it barely tolerates him in return. When a terrifying new breed of vampire is sighted outside of the city, Remy prepares to investigate alone. But then he encounters the shockingly warmhearted vampire heiress Xiaodan Song and her infuriatingly

arrogant fiancé, vampire lord Zidan Malekh, who may hold the key to defeating the creatures—though he knows associating with them won't do his reputation any favors.

When he's offered a spot alongside them to find the truth about the mutating virus, now known as the Rot, Remy faces a choice. It's one he's certain he'll soon regret. But as the three face dangerous hardships during their journey, Remy develops fond and complicated feelings for the couple. He begins to question what he holds true about vampires, as well as the story behind his own family legacy. As the Rot continues to spread across the kingdom, Remy must decide where his loyalties lie: with his father and the kingdom he's spent his life defending, or the vampires who might just be the death of him.



Remy Pendergast, vampire hunter, and his unexpected companions, royal vampires Lord Zidan Malekh and Lady Xiaodan Song, are on the road through the kingdom of Aluria again after a hard-won first battle against the formidable Night Empress, who threatens to undo a fragile peace between humans and vampires. Xiaodan, severely injured, has lost her powers to vanquish the enemy's new superbreed of vampire, but if the trio can make it to Fata Morgana, the seat of Malehk's court—dubbed "the Court of Wanderers"—there is hope of nursing her and bringing them back. 

Set in Jim Crow Florida, The Reformatory tells the story of young Robert Stephens Jr., who for a trivial scuffle with a white boy is sent to The Gracetown School for Boys, a segregated reformatory that is a chamber of horrors, and is haunted by the boys that have died there. Determined to escape before he becomes a haint after falling victim to the school's Warden, Robert enlists the help of the school's haints, but the dead have their own motivations. A riveting novel of historical fiction and social horror, this is Due's masterpiece and an elogy for the great-uncle her family lost to the Dozier School for boys that this is inspired by.

Tananarive Due is an award-winning author who teaches Black Horror and Afrofuturism at UCLA. She is an executive producer on Shudder's groundbreaking documentary Horror Noire: A History of Black Horror. She and her husband/collaborator Steven Barnes wrote "A Small Town" for Season 2 of "The Twilight Zone" on CBS All Access. A leading voice in black speculative fiction for more than 20 years, Due has won an American Book Award, an NAACP Image Award, and a British Fantasy Award, and her writing has been included in best-of-the-year anthologies. Her books include Ghost Summer: Stories, My Soul to Keep, and The Good House. She and her late mother, civil rights activist Patricia Stephens Due, co-authored Freedom in the Family: a Mother-Daughter Memoir of the Fight for Civil Rights. She is married to author Steven Barnes, with whom she collaborates on screenplays. They live with their son, Jason, and two cats.



In the Unseen World some magicians will sacrifice anything or anyone for power. Set in a world much like ours where standing is governed by magic, and social status is governed by magical duels. But the power of magic is fading, and the magicians don't know it yet. Well, most of the magicians don't. Enter Sydney: A new duelist of incredible power. That's where the House of Shadows comes in. See, the thing that feeds the magic is that each of the Houses gives their firstborn to the House of Shadows. Sacrifices, really. But sometimes, instead of giving up their own child, they buy one. (This is where Sydney came from.) And as we all know, if you want to do magic, you have to be willing to cut out


your own liver for power. Cutting out someone else's won't work. Most of the magicians in the Unseen World don't know that part. Heads of Houses do. Some of them don't like it. But the House of Shadows doesn't just sacrifice the children. Some of them it trains into magicians themselves. It's not happy about the weakening state of magic, and it has plans to stop it. An Unkindness of Magicians is a magical thriller of conspiracies and dark plots from the critically acclaimed Kat Howard.

Kat Howard is a writer of fantasy, science fiction, and horror who lives and writes in New Hampshire. Her short fiction has been nominated for the World Fantasy Award, performed on NPR, and anthologized in year's best and best of volumes. Howard, Kat <u>SLEIGHT OF SHADOWS (The Unseen World #2)</u> April 2023





Vis, the adopted son of Magnus Quintus Ulcisor, a prominent senator within the Hierarchy, is trained to enter the famed Catenan Academy to help Ulciscor learn what is hidden agenda of the remote island academy. Secretly, he also wants Vis to discover what happed to his brother who died at the academy, further, he's sure the current Principalis of the academy, Quintus Veridius Julii, a political rival, knows much more than he's revealing. The Academy's vigorous syllabus is a challenge Vis is ably suited to meet, but it is the training in the use of Will, a practice that Vis finds abhorrent, that he must learn in order to excel at the Academy. Will – a concept that encompasses their

energy, drive, focus, initiative, ambition and vitality – can be voluntarily 'ceded' to someone else. A single recipient can accept ceded Wills from multiple people, and so on, growing in power towards superhuman levels. Within the hierarchy your level of Will, or legal rank, determines how you live or die. And there are those who are determined to destroy this hierarchal system, as well as those in the Academy who use it to gain dominance in international bestselling author James Islington's (The Licanius trilogy) wonderfully crafted new epic fantasy series.



The Black Guy Dies First explores the wild, wicked, waggish journey of Blacks in modern horror cinema, from the fodder epitomized by Spider Baby to the cinematic heights of Get Out and beyond. It discusses the themes, tropes, and traits that have come to characterize Black roles in horror since 1968, a year in which race made national headlines in iconic moments like: the Kerner Commission indicting "White racism" for U.S. social ills in February; enactment of the 1968 Civil Right Act and Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination in April; Olympic medalists Tommie Smith and John Carlos raising their "Black Power" fists in October; and Star Trek airing American television's first interracial kiss in

November.

Dr. Robin R. Means Coleman is Northwestern's vice president and associate provost for diversity and inclusion, chief diversity officer, and the Ida B. Wells. An internationally prominent and award-winning scholar, Dr. Coleman's work focuses on media studies and the cultural politics of Blackness. Dr. Coleman is the author of Horror Noire: Blacks in American Horror Films from the 1890s to Present (2011, Routledge) and African-American Viewers and the Black Situation Comedy: Situating Racial Humor (2000, Routledge). She is co-author of Intercultural Communication for Everyday Life (2014, Wiley-Blackwell). She is the editor of Say It Loud! African American Audiences, Media, and Identity (2002, Routledge) and co-editor of Fight the Power! The Spike Lee Reader (2008, Peter Lang). She is also the author of a number of other academic and popular publications. Dr. Coleman is featured in, and executive produced, the critically acclaimed documentary film Horror Noire which is based on her book Horror Noire: Blacks in American Horror Films from the 1890s to Present.
