At present, Latinos comprise 20 percent of the US population, a number that is growing. By 2050, census reports project that one in every three Americans will claim Latino heritage.

Marie Arana draws on her own experience as the daughter of an American mother and Peruvian father who came to the US at age nine, straddling two worlds, as many Latinos do. LatinoLand unabashedly celebrates Latino resilience and character and shows us why we must understand the fastest-growing minority in America.

Marie Arana is the author of the memoir *American Chica*, a finalist for the National Book Award; two novels, *Cellophane* and *Lima Nights*; the prizewinning biography *Bolivar*; *Silver*, *Sword*, *and Stone*, a narrative history of Latin America; and *The Writing Life*, a collection from her well-known column for The Washington Post. She is the inaugural Literary Director of the Library of Congress.

The Right Kind of White reimagines a white identity through a lens of compassion, curiosity and nuance, Garrett Bucks documents his various attempts and failures to define himself in relation to other White people--as either heroes to admire or villains to reject--the limits of those definitions and the journey to create a more expansive language for his white identity. In our current political moment where white Americans are being asked to reevaluate how American history, policy, and mass media informs the way they see Black and Brown Americans, Bucks' memoir specifically models what the challenge looks like for a white American man to re-envision what being white can mean if it's centered on an affirmative sense of cultural identity that isn't dependent on exclusion.

Garrett Bucks is the founder of The Barnraisers Project, which has trained nearly 1000 participants to organize majority-White communities for racial and social justice. He is also the author the popular newsletter *The White Pages*.

Jared Cohen LIFE AFTER POWER



New York Times bestselling author of *Accidental Presidents* explores what retirement looks like from the most powerful job in the world: President of the United States.

The American presidency is not a lifetime appointment. Former presidents are citizens. Like the rest of us, they have to move on. Though Americans know a great deal about the presidents, we know much less about what they do when they're no longer commander in chief. But there's still much to learn from the people who led America in war and peace, and then had to figure out what to do next.

In some cases, the post-presidency was even more compelling than their time in power. Herbert Hoover had one of the most productive post-presidencies in history. George W. Bush made a totally clean break, which is something no other president has done. William Howard Taft is the only person in American history to lead two of the three branches of the federal government. He was both president and Chief Justice of the United States. John Adams is the only former president to become a member of the House of Representatives. He had a powerful second act in Congress after a mediocre presidency. In a much lower office, he found a much higher calling, leading the cause of abolition for nine terms. Grover Cleveland is the only former president to run for the White House again and win.

In this gripping and illuminating work, Jared Cohen examines seven inspiring post presidential stories and shows us how we readers might find these profiles useful in our own lives and our understanding of American history.

Joseph Epstein <u>NEVER YOU'VE HAD A LUCKY LIFE</u>

A rich and comic portrait of the radical changes in American life and the literary world over the last eighty years.

Joseph Epstein's life has been emblematic of the great changes in our country since World War II. He grew up in a petit-bourgeois, Midwestern milieu, and the city of Chicago looms large in his life. He had a happy boyhood spent on playgrounds and hanging around drug stores. At twenty-six, after two years in the army, he found himself married, the father or stepfather of four children, and living in New York on the meager salary of a magazine subeditor. He was ablaze with ambition and fettered by frustration. He broke out by moving to Little Rock, Arkansas,

to direct the city's anti-poverty program at the height of the Civil Rights movement. His writing career blossomed, he began teaching at Northwestern University, and, for twenty-five years, edited one of great intellectual magazines.

Never Say You've Had a Lucky Life is an intimate look at one life steeped in radical change: from a traditionally moral culture to a therapeutic one, from an era when the extended family was strong to its current diminished status, from print to digital life featuring the war of pixel on print, and on. But for all the seriousness of Epstein's themes, this book is memorable for its comic point of view and the constant reminder of how unpredictable, various, and wondrously rich life can be.

Joseph Epstein is the author of seventeen collections of essays, four collections of short stories, biographies of Alexis de Tocqueville and Fred Astaire, and books on the subjects of snobbery, friendship, gossip, ambition, envy, the novel, and charm. He was the editor of *The American Scholar* from 1975 to 1997.

Patric Gagne is a writer, therapist, and advocate for people suffering from sociopathic personality disorder. She holds a PhD in clinical psychology from UCLA. Her dissertation examined the relationship between sociopaths and their reactions to anxiety. This research became the groundwork for her continued studies on sociopathic disorder, as well as the foundation for her memoir.

This collection of handwritten love letters offers a surprising and intimate portrait of the men who occupied the White House. From George Washington to Barack Obama, these are not the presidents we see in history books. Instead, when they courted the women they wanted to marry, or seduced the women outside of their marriage, they often showed a side the public did not see—playful, passionate, tender, consumed by desire.

Some of the letters are incredibly romantic, surprisingly so. Others will make you blush such as a letter from Woodrow Wilson returning from a trip to his wife "Do you think you can stand the innumerable kisses and the passionate embraces you will receive? Are you prepared for the storm of lovemaking with which you will be assailed?" In letters to one of his mistresses, Warren G. Harding referred to his penis as "Jerry." These letters were later used to blackmail him.

All the letters show the writer at his most vulnerable. We see letters of sorrow, written about the death of a child or during a time of separation while the president was away on the battlefield. This beautiful book is a delightful collection of love stories that reveal a human side of the men we still honor today.

Dorothy and Tom Hoobler have written many award-winning books for adults and young adults. Their YA mystery set in medieval Japan won an Edgar from the Mystery Writers of America. Their ten-book series on American ethnic groups received many favorable reviews from such publications as the *New York Times* and the *Miami Herald*. Seventy-five percent of all mental health disorders emerge by the age of twenty-five, and twentysomethings are more likely to face depression, anxiety, and substance abuse than any other age group. Donald G. McNeil, Jr. The WISDOM OF PLAGUES

Award-winning *New York Times* reporter Donald G. McNeil Jr. reflects on twenty-five years of covering pandemics—how governments react to them, how the media covers them, how they are exploited, and what we can do to prepare for the next one.

Donald McNeil is a regular reporter on *The New York Times*'s popular podcast *The Daily* and told listeners early on to prepare for the worst when the Covid 19 pandemic started. He'd covered public health for twenty-five years and quickly realized that an obscure virus in Wuhan, China, was destined to grow into a global pandemic rivaling the 1918 Spanish flu.

Because of his prescient work, *The New York Times* won the 2021 Pulitzer Gold Medal for Public Service.

The Wisdom of Plagues is his account of what he learned over a quarter-century of reporting in over sixty countries. His expertise and breadth of sources let him make many accurate predictions in 2020 about the course that a deadly new virus would take and how different countries would respond.

By the time McNeil wrote his last *New York Times* stories, he had not lost his compassion—but he had grown far more stone-hearted about how governments should react. He had witnessed enough disasters to realize that while every epidemic is different, failure was the one constant. Small case-clusters ballooned into catastrophe because weak leaders became mired in denial. Citizens refused to make even minor sacrifices for the common good. They were encouraged in that by money-hungry entrepreneurs and power-hungry populists. Science was ignored, obvious truths were denied, and the innocent too often died. In *The Wisdom of Plagues*, McNeil offers tough, prescriptive advice on what we can do to improve global health and be better prepared for the inevitable next pandemic.

The prompt seemed simple: *Race. Your Story. Six Words. Please Send.* The answers, though, have been challenging and complicated. In the twelve years since Michele Norris first posed that

question, over half a million people have submitted their stories to *The Race Card Project* inbox. The stories are shocking in their depth and candor, spanning the full spectrum of race, ethnicity, identity, and class. The responses reveal fear, pain, triumph, and sometimes humor.

Our Hidden Conversation is a unique compilation of stories, richly reported essays, and photographs providing a window into America during a tumultuous era. This powerful book offers an honest, if sometimes uncomfortable, conversation about race and identity,

permitting us to eavesdrop on deep-seated thoughts, private discussions, and long submerged memories. Over the course of 12 years since founding The Race Card project, Norris has archived more than 250,000 stories. There is a large built-in audience that sees itself as stakeholders in this project and will find their stories in these pages. Several organizations, including churches, universities, nonprofits, and large corporations have already used The Race Card Project as a guide to discussions about race.

Michele Norris is a columnist for *The Washington Post* Opinion Section and a former co-host of NPR's *All Things Considered*. Norris is also the founding director of The Race Card Project, a Peabody Award–winning narrative archive where people around the world share their reflections on identity—in just six words. Her first book, *The Grace of Silence*, was named one of the best books of the year by the *San Francisco Chronicle*, *The Christian Science Monitor*, and *The Kansas City Star*.

They share insightful anecdotes: how he kept connected to his Ohio upbringing; nearly blew his 90210 audition; tried to shed his heartthrob image by joining the HBO prison drama O_z ; and in the last year of his life, sought to set up two of his newly divorced friends. Amid these original interviews and exhaustive archival research, Wappler weaves poignant vignettes of memoir in which she serves as an avatar to show how Perry shaped a generation's views on masculinity, privilege and the ideal of "cool."

Timed to the fifth anniversary of Perry's death, *A Good Bad Boy* is a profound and entertaining examination of what it means to be an artist and an adult.

The astonishing story of Dr. Josephine Janina Mehlberg—a Jewish mathematician who saved thousands of lives in Nazi-occupied Poland by masquerading as a Polish aristocrat—drawing on Mehlberg's own unpublished memoir.

Dr. Mehlberg operated in Lublin, Poland, headquarters of *Aktion* Reinhard, the SS operation that murdered 1.7 million Jews in occupied Poland. Using the identity papers of a Polish aristocrat, she worked as a welfare official while also serving in the Polish resistance. With guile, cajolery, and steely persistence, the "Countess" persuaded SS officials to release thousands of Poles from the Majdanek concentration camp. She won permission to deliver

food and medicine—even decorated Christmas trees—for thousands more of the camp's prisoners. At the same time, she personally smuggled supplies and messages to resistance fighters imprisoned at Majdanek, where 63,000 Jews were murdered in gas chambers and shooting pits. Incredibly, she eluded detection, and ultimately survived the war and emigrated to the US.

Drawing on the manuscript of Mehlberg's own unpublished memoir, supplemented with prodigious research, Elizabeth White and Joanna Sliwa, professional historians and Holocaust experts, have uncovered the full story of this remarkable woman. Like *The Light of Days, Schindler's List,* and *Irena's Children, The Counterfeit Countess* is an unforgettable account of inspiring courage in the face of unspeakable cruelty.

Dr. Elizabeth White recently retired from the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, where she served as historian and as Research Director for the USHMM's Center for the Prevention of Genocide. Dr. Joanna Sliwa is a historian at the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (Claims Conference) in New York, where she also administers academic programs.

But then Cecilia's soon-to-be-ex-husband Paul reaches out to Rose. He thinks the cabaret might be dangerous and that Cecilia's disappearance might not be temporary. Paul and Rose team up to try to figure out just what the cabaret is—and whether its members have lethal aims. And it soon becomes clear that the only way for Rose to find Cecilia—and to find out if she's alive—is to join the cabaret herself. She'll just need to find it first. And once she does, Rose will have to decide what type of world she wants to live in and what it truly means to have a meaningful life.

immigrant suburbs, and, ultimately, the loneliness of single motherhood. But it is the birth of her daughter that forces the novel's central question: What does it mean to make a home?

Written with uncommon poise and full of incisive observations, HABITATIONS is the zoomed-in, intimate story of one woman, but it is also a universal story of womanhood, identity, love and the meaning of home. Sundar writes about the difficulties (and joys) of being a woman forced to navigate multiple loyalties: to oneself, to one's family, and to one's community.
