





Dominic Salt and his three children are caretakers of Shearwater, a tiny island not far from Antarctica. Home to the world's largest seed bank, Shearwater was once full of researchers. But with sea levels rising, the Salts are now its final inhabitants, packing up the seeds before they are transported to safer ground. Despite the wild beauty of life here, isolation has taken its toll on the Salts. Raff, eighteen and suffering his first heartbreak, can only find relief at his punching bag; Fen, seventeen, has started spending her nights on the beach among the seals; nine-year-old Orly, obsessed with botany, fears the loss of his beloved natural world; and Dominic can't stop turning back toward the past, and the loss that drove the family to Shearwater in the first place. Then, during the worst storm the island has ever seen, a woman washes up on shore. As the Salts nurse the woman, Rowan, back to life, their suspicion gives way to affection, and they finally begin to feel like a family again. Rowan, long accustomed to protecting her heart, begins to fall for the Salts, too. But Rowan isn't telling the whole truth about why she set out for Shearwater. And when she discovers the sabotaged radios and a freshly dug grave, she realizes Dominic is keeping his own dark secrets. As the storms on Shearwater gather force, the characters must decide if they can trust each other enough to protect the precious seeds in their care before it's too late—and if they can finally put the tragedies of the past behind them to create something new, together. A novel of heartstopping twists, dizzying beauty, and ferocious love, *Wild Dark Shore* is about the impossible choices we make to protect the people we love, even as the world around us is ending.

In Brewer, girls in white appear in the snow, in the woods, and the middle of roads. And while none of their faces match the photos on the missing persons posters scattered all over town, evidence of neglect echoes in their unwavering silence. After a chilling encounter with one of these girls, Alma Figueroa—underemployed, divorced, and already kept on the periphery as one of the few Latinas in the Scandinavian-descended town—starts investigating. But soon she uncovers something larger, something the town has been actively ignoring, that might just connect back to her sister Kayla's death years earlier and what really happened on that dreadful night. If only she can figure out what the girls are trying to tell her in time. Gabrielle Lucille Fuentes' *Here Is Clear Water* unfolds over three timelines, moving between the present-day reappearance of these stealthy girls, the romantic entanglement with a high school flame from Alma's past, and the teenage years in which Kayla sinks further into her addiction. Mixing elements of mystery, noir, myth, and horror, this lush and lyrical book is a poignant story about sisters, secrets, racial passing, grief, and what it means when the people in authority continue to overlook the most vulnerable in their community.

Outside, resistance groups and brutal cartels fight to shape the world's future, but Camille is safe within her routines. That is, until a new zookeeper, Sailor, arrives from Paris. From their first meeting, Camille is drawn to brash, defiant Sailor, who seems to see something in Camille that no one has before. Together, they bond over their shared passion for their charges and dream up ways to improve their lives. When Sailor whispers the story of an idyllic, secret sanctuary, where wild animals roam free, Camille begins to imagine a new kind of life, with Sailor by her side. Sailor knows all too well the dangers beyond Alcatraz, but she increasingly chafes at the zoo's rigid rules. She hatches a reckless plan to smuggle one of the most prized animals off the island to freedom and invites Camille to join her. The consequences if they fail would be catastrophic, and Sailor's contacts at the sanctuary go dark just as the threats from the cartels grow more extreme. Camille must decide if she's ready to risk everything for Sailor's bold escape, to brave the promise of a better world. Soaring and poignant, propulsive and fiercely hopeful, with a heart-stopping final twist, *The Island of Last Things* is an elegy for a disappearing world and a gorgeous vision for the future.


In the years after the glaciers melt, Nonie, her older sister, her parents, and their researcher friends have stayed behind in an almost deserted New York City, creating a settlement on the roof of the American Museum of Natural History. The rule: Take from the exhibits only in dire need. They hunt and grow their food in Central Park as they work to save the collections of human history and science. When a superstorm breaches the city's flood walls, Nonie and her family must escape north on the Hudson. They carry with them a book that holds their records of the lost collections. Racing on the swollen river towards what may be safety, they encounter communities that have adapted in very different and sometimes frightening ways to the new reality. But they are determined to find a way to make a new world that honors all they've saved. Inspired by the stories of the curators in Iraq and Leningrad who worked to protect their collections from war, *All the Water in the World* is the story of a wild journey and also offers the hope that what matters most—love and work, community and knowledge—will survive.





In a sleepy German village, Allina Gottlieb's life is idyllic: she works at the bookshop with her uncle, makes strudel with her aunt, and spends the weekends with her friends and fiancé. But it's 1939, and on one fateful night, her life changes forever. *The Sunflower House* is a meticulously-researched debut historical novel set at Hochland Home, part of the notorious Lebensborn Program in Nazi Germany. Women of "pure" blood resided there for the sole purpose of perpetuating the Aryan population, giving birth to hundreds of babies who were then raised—and neglected—in this state-run baby factory. With her life on the line, Allina is forced to work as a nurse in Hochland Home. ## THE ZORG: A Ship, a Murder, and a Trial That Inspired the Abolition of Slavery by Siddharth Kara (St. Martin's Press, September 2025)

From the author of the *New York Times* bestselling and Pulitzer Prize finalist book *Cobalt Red* comes a compelling history about a notorious slave ship incident that led to a sensational trial in English, the abolition of slavery in the U.K., and sparked the U.S. abolitionist movement. In late October 1780, a slave ship set sail from the Netherlands, bound for Africa's Windward and Gold Coasts, where it would take on its awful human cargo. The *Zorg* (a Dutch word meaning both "care" and "worry") was one of thousands of such ships, but the harrowing events that ensued on its doomed journey were unique. After reaching Africa, the *Zorg* was captured by a privateer and came under British command. With a new captain and crew, the ship was crammed with 442 slaves and departed in 1781 for Jamaica. But a series of unpredictable weather events and mistakes in navigation left the ship drastically off course and running out of food and water. So a proposition was put forth: Save the crew and the most valuable of the slaves—by throwing 140 people, mostly women and children, overboard. What followed was a fascinating legal drama in England's highest court that turned the brutal calculus of slavery into front page news. For the first time, concepts such as human rights and morality entered the discourse on slavery, in a notorious case that boiled down to a simple but profound question: Were the Africans on board the *Zorg* people or cargo? The case of the *Zorg* catapulted the nascent anti-slavery movement from a minor evangelical cause to one of the most consequential moral campaigns in history. In this book, Siddharth Kara utilizes primary source research, masterful storytelling, and painstaking investigation to uncover the *Zorg*'s journey, the lives and fates of the slaves on board, and the mystery of who finally revealed the truth of what happened on the ship.

**Siddharth Kara** is an author, researcher, and activist on modern slavery. He is a British Academy Global Professor and an Associate Professor of Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery at Nottingham University. Kara has authored several books and reports on slavery and child labor, and he won the Frederick Douglass Book Prize. He has also taught courses on modern slavery at Harvard University, UC Berkeley, and Cornell University. He divides his time between the U.K. and the U.S.



Along the rugged shores of Maui's east coast lies one of the last remaining places of *real* Hawai'i, untouched by international hotels or tacky bus tours. This is Sara Goo's family's ancestral Hawaiian lands. For centuries, these lands were the crown jewels of Native Hawaiian royalty. More than sixty acres of this land, from the road to the sea, worth untold millions of dollars, are still owned by the Kahanu family. Part journalistic offering and part memoir, *Kuleana* chronicles acclaimed reporter Sara Kehaulani Goo's journey in helping her father save their family land and captures the complicated feelings that arise over her own mixed-race heritage and U.S. upbringing along the way. In the style of *Lost and Found* and *The Yellow House*, Goo interrogates deeper questions of identity, belonging, and what it means to hold onto a legacy that threatens to slip away. Goo's breathtaking story of unexpected homecomings, familial hardship, and fierce devotion to ancestry is a tale not easily forgotten.



From the moment they met in 1940 in Ravensbrück concentration camp, Milena Jesenska and Margarete Buber-Neumann were inseparable. Milena was Kafka's first translator and epistolary lover, and a journalist opposed to fascism. A non-conformist, bi-sexual feminist, she was way ahead of her time. With the German occupation of Czechoslovakia, her home became a central meeting place for Jewish refugees. Margarete, born to a middle-class family in Germany, married the son of the Jewish philosopher Martin Buber. But soon swept up in the fervor of the Bolshevik Revolution, she met her second partner, the Communist Heinz Neumann. Called to Moscow for his "political deviations," he fell victim to Stalin's purges while Margarete was exiled to the hell of the Soviet gulag. Two years later, traded by Stalin to Hitler, she ended up outside Berlin in Ravensbrück, the only concentration camp built for women. Milena and Margarete loved each other at the risk of their lives. But in the post-war survivors' accounts, lesbians were stigmatized, and survivors kept silent. This book explores those silences, and finally celebrates two strong women who never gave up and continue to inspire. As Margarete wrote: "I was thankful for having been sent to Ravensbrück, because it was there I met Milena."

Gwen Strauss is the author of *The Nine* and a collection of poetry, *Trail of Stones*. Her poems, short stories and essays have appeared in numerous journals including *The New Republic, London Sunday Times, New England Review*, and *Kenyon Review*. She was born and spent her early years in Haiti. Strauss lives in Southern France, where she is the Executive Director of the Dora Maar Cultural Center
