




A Walk in the Park chronicles a year-long effort to carve an 800-mile transect along the length of the Grand Canyon through a vertical wilderness that is suspended between the caprock along the rims of the abyss and the Colorado River, which tumbles along its bottom. Fedarko was accompanied through this sublime and often dangerous terrain by the award-winning photographer Peter McBride. During the course of their journey, they discovered that the canyon's future as a symbol of pristine wilderness is jeopardized by commercial development, uranium mining, and overcrowding—a litany of threats poised not only to inflict damage along the edges of the canyon but also to strike directly at its core.

The book opens a window into the defining features of the crown jewel of America's National Parks: an iconic landscape framed by unimaginably ancient rock whose contours are recognized by all, but whose secrets and treasures are known to almost no one.

Kevin Fedarko has spent the past twenty years writing about conservation, exploration, and the Grand Canyon. He is the author of the *New York Times* bestseller *The Emerald Mile: The Epic Story of the Fastest Ride in History Through the Heart of the Grand Canyon*, winner of the National Outdoor Book Award and the Reading the West Award. Fedarko studied Russian history at Oxford before joining the staff at *Time* Magazine, where he worked primarily on the foreign affairs desk, then later moved to *Outside* Magazine, where he was a senior editor.

For the doomed stand American forces made in the Philippines at the start of World War II, two generals received their country's highest military award, the Medal of Honor. One was the charismatic and controversial Douglas MacArthur, whose orders forced him to leave his soldiers on the islands to starvation and surrender but whose vow to return echoed around the globe. The other was the gritty Jonathan Mayhew Wainwright, who became a hero to the troops whose fate he insisted on sharing even when it meant becoming the highest-ranking American prisoner of the Japanese. In *The Fate of the Generals*, bestselling author Jonathan Horn brings together the story of two men who won the same medal but found honor on very different paths. MacArthur's journey would require a daring escape with his wife and young child to Australia and then years of fighting over the thousands of miles needed to make it back to the Philippines, where he would fulfill his famous vow only to see the city he called home burn.

Jonathan Horn is the author of Washington's End and the Robert E. Lee biography The Man Who Would Not Be Washington, which was a Washington Post bestseller. Earlier in his career, he served at the White House as a presidential speechwriter. He has written for outlets including The Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post, The New York Times Disunion series, New York Post, The Daily Beast, National Review, and POLITICO, and has appeared on CBS Sunday Morning, CNN, Fox News, MSNBC, and PBS NewsHour. A graduate of Yale, he lives in Bethesda, Maryland, with his wife, two children, and dog.

Since 2012, *Jeopardy!* champion and host Ken Jennings has created a weekly puzzle—first for *Parade*, then for *Mental Floss*—involving a series of trivia questions whose answers have something in common. The trivia questions cover a full gamut of topics, from pop culture (movies, TV, music) to more academic knowledge (history, geography, the arts) to lifestyle (food and drink, sports, consumer pursuits). The final connection can be even more varied. Many of the quizzes stick to canonical trivia categories (D-Day beaches! Presidential middle names! Santa's reindeer! Batman villains!) but almost anything goes. What do feet, McDonald's, fingerprints, and St. Louis have in common? They all have arches. What about Mercury, Chihuahuas, electrons, and Rhode Island? They're all the smallest of their kind. Columbia, Grease, and "I Ran" (by A Flock of Seagulls)? They're all homophones for country names.

While the vast majority of the Kennections canon had been lost to time in the bowels of the internet, it's now available in one convenient volume—*The Complete Kennections*, the perfect gift for any *Jeopardy!* fan, trivia buff, or *New York Times*' "Connections" puzzler.

Ken Jennings is the *New York Times* bestselling author of *Brainiac*, *Maphead*, *Because I Said So!*, and *Planet Funny*. In 2020, he won the "Greatest of All Time" title on the quiz show *Jeopardy!* and in 2022, he succeeded Alex Trebek as a host of the show. He is living in Seattle during his mortal sojourn, but his posthumous whereabouts are still to be determined.

"In early August of 2015, I moved back to Mississippi from New York to be closer to God. My God, for the entirety of my life, has been my grandmother."

When Kiese Laymon returned to Mississippi in 2015, he didn't move to Forest, where his grandmother lives, he moved to Oxford, where he took a position as a professor at Ole Miss. While he was closer to his grandmother, Oxford was several hours away from Forest and his hometown of Jackson--and culturally a world apart. Living there, in a Confederate general's old house on what had been plantation land, was an isolating and lonely experience.

In *Good God,* Kiese considers the ways that American conceptions of good and God are wrongheaded. He tells the story of a Black man coming back home, alone, to a state he never wanted to leave as a Black boy, and a Black woman, who never left. He tells stories about the past, with hopes for a different future--and as he artfully explores the particular American spin on good and god, he finds love and acceptance, again and again, from the woman he came home to eulogize.

Born and raised in Jackson, Mississippi, **Kiese Laymon** is the Ottilie Schillig Professor in English and Creative Writing at the University of Mississippi and author of the novel *Long Division*, the memoir *Heavy*, and the essay collection *How to Slowly Kill Yourself and Others in America*. He was recently named a 2022 MacArthur Fellow.







Robert Crumb is often credited with single-handedly transforming the comics medium into a place for adult expression, in the process pioneering the underground comic book industry, and transforming the vernacular language of 20th-century America into an instantly recognizable and popular aesthetic, as iconic as Walt Disney or Charles Schulz. Now, for the first time, Dan Nadel, a curator and writer specializing in comics and art, shares how this complicated artist survived childhood abuse, fame in his twenties, more fame, and came out the other side intact. More than just a biography of an iconic cartoonist, *Crumb* is the story of a richly complex life at the forefront of both the underground and popular cultures of post-war America.

Dan Nadel is a writer and curator. His previous books include, *It's Life as a I See It: Black Cartoonists in Chicago, 1940–1980*; *Peter Saul: Professional Artist Correspondence, 1945–1976*; and *Art Out of Time: Unknown Comic Visionaries, 1900–1969*. Nadel has curated exhibitions for galleries and museums internationally including the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago, the Manetti Shrem Museum of Art, UC Davis, and the Whitney Museum of American Art. He is the founder of PictureBox, a publishing and packaging company that produced over one hundred books, objects, and zines from 2000 to 2014, including the Grammy Award–winning design for Wilco's 2004 album *A Ghost Is Born*. Dan is the curator-at-large for the Lucas Museum of Narrative Art. He lives in Brooklyn, New York, with his family.

Animal corpses have been turning up throughout Charlotte, North Carolina, mutilated and displayed in the same bizarre manner. Small creatures—a rat, a rabbit, a squirrel. But one day, as Tempe is relaxing at home alongside her aimless, moody great niece Tory, she's diverted by a disturbing call. Now, it seems, the perp is upping the ante. This find is larger. Could the remains be human?

Tempe visits the scene and discovers that the victim is a dog. Someone's pet. As one who has always found animal cruelty deeply abhorrent, Tempe vows to help apprehend the degenerate responsible for the killings, and due to Tory's especially layered knowledge of animal behavior, the young woman turns out to be a valuable ally in the hunt for answers.

And then it happens. A woman is found disfigured and posed following the same MO of the grisly animal killings. The clock is ticking. Who will be next?

Kathy Reichs's first novel *Déjà Dead*, published in 1997, won the Ellis Award for Best First Novel and was an international bestseller. *Fire and Bones* is Reichs's twenty-third novel featuring forensic anthropologist Temperance Brennan. Reichs was also a producer of Fox Television's longest running scripted drama, *Bones*, which was based on her work and her novels. One of very few forensic anthropologists certified by the American Board of Forensic Anthropology, Reichs divides her time between Charlotte, North Carolina, and Charleston, South Carolina. 



Most scholars and analysts believe that the primary cause of our abysmal war record since Vietnam has been the US military's overwhelmingly conventional approach—which favors kinetic operations, highly mobile precision firepower, and sophisticated systems of command and control. Here, Warren argues that the more formidable obstacle to success has been pervasive strategic ineptitude at the highest levels of Washington, including the executive branch, congress, and the national security council responsible for shaping US foreign policy. Presidents of both political parties, including Kennedy, Reagan, Bush, Clinton, and Obama have overestimated the capacity of US forces to alter the social and political landscape of foreign nations, and underestimated the ability of insurgents and terrorists to develop strategies that draw out conflict and wage effective propaganda campaigns to curtail Washington's will to carry on the fight. Warren concludes the book by advocating for a less hubristic foreign policy and a broader conception of warfare as a political and military enterprise.

James A. Warren is a historian and foreign policy analyst. A regular contributor to *The Daily Beast*, he is the author of *God, War, and Providence: The Epic Struggle of Roger Williams and the Narragansett Indians against the Puritans of New England; American Spartans: The US Marines: A Combat History from Iwo Jima to Iraq; and The Lions of Iwo Jima: The Story of Combat Team 28 and the Bloodiest Battle in Marine Corps History* (with Major General Fred Haynes, USMC-RET), among other books.

Ernest Hemingway did more to change the style of English prose than any other writer of his time. Publication of The Sun Also Rises and A Farewell to Arms immediately established Hemingway as one of the greatest literary lights of the twentieth century. His classic novel The Old Man and the Sea won the Pulitzer Prize in 1953. Hemingway was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1954. His life and accomplishments are explored in-depth in the PBS documentary film from Ken Burns and Lynn Novick, Hemingway. Known for his largerthan-life personality and his passions for bullfighting, fishing, and big-game hunting, he died in Ketchum, Idaho on July 2, 1961.
