Pepsi loves life, and the searing summer heat on her grandfather’s remote farm in Dalmatia. Her parents are working in Germany, and only visit once a year, during the summer holidays. Occasionally, she stays with other relatives, but wherever she is, she never feels at home. Nature is her only friend, and she spends her days barefoot in the grass, fascinated by the language of the birds. When Pepsi’s parents finally take her to Germany, to live with them and her siblings in a tiny flat, she immediately wants to leave. Her mother’s hands are rough from her cleaning job, and incapable of being gentle; and her father begins each day with a glass of schnapps. At the same time, Pepsi is enchanted by some of the things her new life has in store for her: the world of books and writing, the German language – with which she falls in love as quickly and passionately as with Aleksandar... But when Pepsi tells her parents she wants to keep going to school until she’s eighteen, and then to university, they say no. After all, she isn’t a boy! It’s a stab in the heart, a departure – and a new beginning.

One day, a trivial event makes Natalie think of her late grandfather Anatole. She wonders: who was this man, who felt so torn between Germany and France? For the first time, she really tries to understand her grandfather, who always felt like a stranger and yet helped shape her life. When he was young he joined the French Army, but was then drafted into the German army during the Second World War. Afterwards, he aligned himself with the French – going so far as to reject his own daughter when she married a German.

With lyrical precision, Buchholz examines the reasons that Anatole shut off his heart from his own daughter like that, tells the story of a German–French family whose ambivalence and uncertainty is reflected in the history of Alsace-Lorraine, and makes an unpleasant discovery in the process.

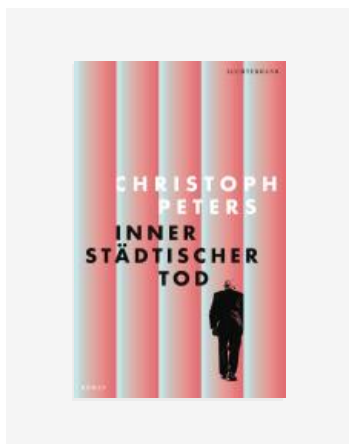

Family rifts and political radicalisation: a sharp-tongued, witty tale of what divides us

Berlin, the 9th of November 2022. The Russian attack on Ukraine is affecting people's private lives, as well as the atmosphere generally. Tonight, aspiring artist Fabian Kolb will open his first solo exhibition at the famous Konrad Raspe gallery. Fabian's family are his hometown's last surviving tie manufacturers, and they have travelled across the country especially for the event. His uncle Hermann, the ageing ideologue-in-chief of the German parliament's New Right faction, is contemplating how to catch the media's attention at the launch; while Fabian's father hopes to use his brother-in-law's international contact list to find a way to keep exporting his ties to Russia. As the exhibition approaches, Fabian begins to have doubts about the compromises he's making for the sake of international renown – particularly when some of Raspe's former staff go public with some very serious accusations against the gallery owner.

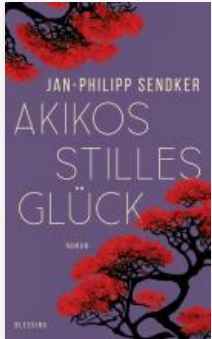

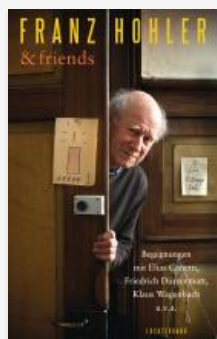
Jan-Philipp Sendker, born in Hamburg, spent many years working as US and Asia correspondent for Stern magazine. After a further spell in the US, he returned to Germany, and has since published several books, including a collection of portraits entitled "Risse in der Großen Mauer" ('Cracks in the Great Wall'; Blessing, 2000). His bestselling novel "Das Herzenshören" ('The Art of Hearing Heartbeats', 2002) was followed by "Das Flüstern der Schatten" ('Whispering Shadows', 2007), "Drachenspiele" ('The Language of Solitude', 2009), "Herzenstimmen" ('A Well-Tempered Heart', 2012), "Am anderen Ende der Nacht" ('The Far Side of the Night', 2016), "Das Geheimnis des alten Mönches" ('The Long Path to Wisdom: Tales from Burma', 2017), "Das Gedächtnis des Herzens" ('The Heart Remembers', 2019) and "Die Rebellin und der Dieb" ('The Rebel and the Thief', 2021).
