### Days in Backlight

Five houses on stilts—the summer quarters of a handful of families in Médoc. Since childhood, Judith has spent every August here. Surfing in the Atlantic, swimming in the lake, temporary tattoos on sun-tanned skin. And always by Judith's side back then: her little sister Lola and Natascha, the girl from the house next door. Years later, Judith, now a successful sculptor, lives alone with her husband Robert and their twin daughters in house at the corner. Only Oda, Judith's eccentric mother, returns here as well after the death of her father. But even though the house is filled with people again, the painful gaps in Judith's life are most evident here.

When the vacant neighbouring house is put up for sale, Robert is immediately interested. For Judith, however, these four walls and their stories awaken deep-seated memories. And when Natascha suddenly shows up with her husband Simon, all the feelings Judith has been trying to suppress since that summer forty years ago suddenly come flooding back.

Sometimes they meet like brothers, sometimes like rivals, then again like mirror images that cannot bear each other. The more Hendrik neglects his own life and clings to Popóm, the more Popóm withdraws. In the company of his other self, Hendrik hopes to find to find stability and safety from the small and large dramas that can befall anyone. When he confides in a colleague, he realizes that the price of withdrawing from life is too high.

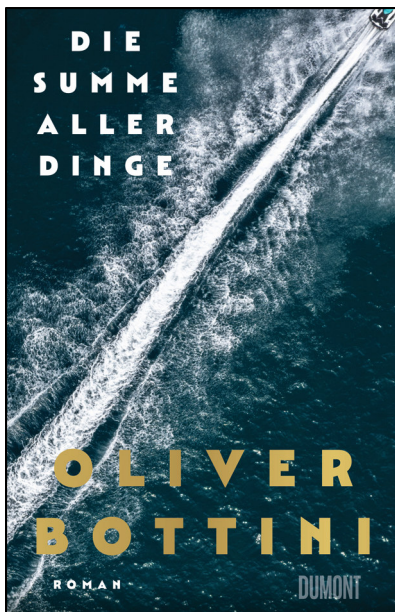

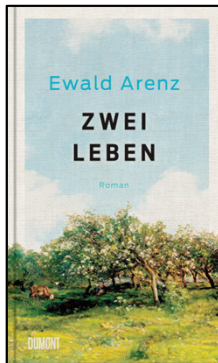

The book's unnamed protagonist, who feels neither male nor female, is prompted by their grandmother's slide into dementia to investigate their family history. Kim de l'Horizon searches for other kinds of knowledge and traditions, other stories and ways of becoming: feminist, witchy, bought with blood, and those that leave a hole in their wake. De l'Horizon leaves the linear, monotonous form of family stories behind and opts for a fluid, streaming form of writing which softens instead of pinning down.

Her questions lead to her origins, to the silent catastrophes in her family. She talks about important girlfriends and the men in her life. And finally she asks the question: How do I want to organise the last third of my time?

With a linguistic density that touches the reader, Judith Kuckart tells the story of her biography and thus sheds light on an entire generation, her own.

By talking about herself, Judith Kuckart's novel aims directly at our own lives: Images, smells and sounds emerge from our past and show us what we have experienced between the news.
